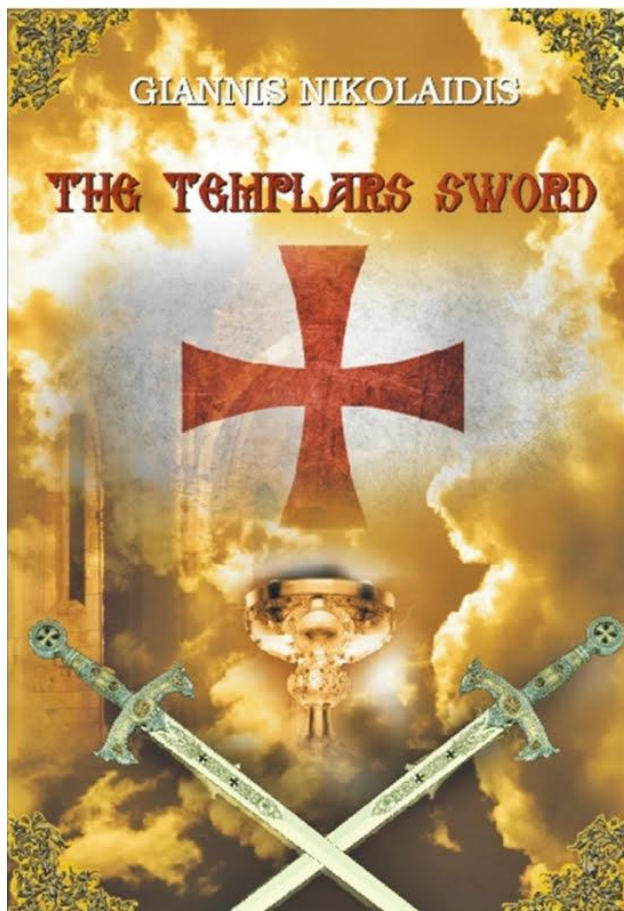




## GIANNIS NIKOLAIDIS
